Presentations:

Tim Terrell spoke about ALICE training for violent critical incidents. ALICE stands for: Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate. ALICE is not sequential, perhaps Escape is the best action to take first.

Alert- Initial awareness- from notification or hearing shots or screams

Lockdown- Barricade door if escape isn't possible. Call 911 if possible. Gather first aid supplies.

Inform- Communicate what, where, when, who, how. Use CCTV to monitor attacker's location if possible. Radios & 911.

Counter- How to Counter: Interrupt the attacker's ability to acquire targets & attack. Rush, throw things, yell, gain distance, etc. About 85% of attacks are not stopped until someone takes aggressive action toward the attacker.

Evacuate- Leave, don't take belongings, don't go to vehicle, evacuate to rally point.
